Classes available in Muskegon, Fremont

MUSKEGON, Mich. – Enrollment for 2017 spring quarter is now open for new and returning students at Baker College’s Muskegon campus, 1903 Marquette Ave. On-ground classes begin Monday, April 3; two sessions of online classes begin Thursday, March 30, and Thursday, May 11.

Programs available at Baker College's Culinary Institute of Michigan, 336 W. Clay Ave., Muskegon, include baking and pastry, culinary arts, and food and beverage management.

The Fremont satellite campus offers bachelor's, associate and certificate programs in health services administration, medical assistant, business administration-accelerated, management, marketing and basic emergency medical technician (EMT), as well as many options available online and through distance learning.

Classes are offered on a quarter basis for 2017 spring and summer sessions and will transition to semesters beginning fall 2017.
