\$50,000 goal to win matching grant through MEDC's Public Spaces Community Places initiative

LANSING, Mich. – The city of Muskegon will soon have a new public art installation with the help of a <u>crowdfunding campaign 2</u>, the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, Michigan Municipal League, and city of Muskegon announced today. The CELEBRATING MUSKEGON campaign is being offered through the Michigan-based crowdfunding platform Patronicity.

"Creative and interactive placemaking is a way to ensure we engage with our public spaces in a dynamic way," said MEDC Senior Vice President of Community Development Michele Wildman. "The CELEBRATING MUSKEGON project is an example of that, and we are pleased to provide resources for this effort through our Public Spaces Community Places program."

This campaign will bring an iconic new sculpture to the roundabout at Pere Marquette Park. The **CELEBRATING MUSKEGON** sculpture will provide an iconic entryway to the lakefront and will be an original sculpture by John Littleton and Kate Vogel created as a tribute to the character and resiliency of the people and communities of Muskegon.

"Muskegon's new sculpture will provide the community with a unique attraction for residents and visitors alike."

The Public Spaces Community Places initiative started in 2014 with MEDC providing matched funding of up to \$50,000 for community improvement projects throughout Michigan. As of June 8, MEDC has provided more than \$7.4 million in matching grants. Since the launch of the program, 240 projects have been successful in reaching their goal, with \$8.65 million raised from 43,759 individual donors.
