

TUESDAY FORUM SERIES KICKS OFF WITH THE INFINITE GAME: MATT DUNSMOOR, SIMON SINEK MASTER TRAINER

The Chamber of Commerce Grand Haven, Spring Lake, Ferrysburg, in partnership with the Grand Haven Area Community Foundation, kicked off their Tuesday Forum Series bright and early on Tuesday, February 28th at Trillium Event Center in Ferrysburg, Michigan. Attendees at this event came from all different backgrounds, including the Community Foundation's Youth Advisory Council Students, business owners, and general members of the community. All came with the same goal; to gather, learn and engage in conversation about how we can work together to build a better future for our community.

The first session of the series was about the Infinite Game with Matt Dunsmoor, a Simon Sinek Master Trainer. Dunsmoor specializes in company culture, innovation, purpose, and leadership development. During his presentation about the Infinite Game, he focused on the difference between finite and infinite games, along with the five practices required to lead in an infinite game. In addition, he explored a new way of looking at leadership, the environment inside an lorganization, how to maintain and rebuild trust, and how we can use these practices to better our community individually.

After the presentation, Leadership Coach and Strategic Planner, Karen McPhee, facilitated a community conversation. It began with a roundtable discussion where participants discussed how their thought processes have been changed or challenged since listening to the keynote and fellow community members. The session ended with each table leader presenting a summary of what they discussed to the rest the group.
